Does Paco have any close friends?



Present Simple (interrogative)

The interrogative structure in the Present Simple follows this pattern:

With an interrogative pronoun:

Question word + auxiliary + subject + verb + infinitive

What do you want to do?

Without an interrogative pronoun:

Auxiliary + subject + verb + infinitive + complement

Do you want to have some fun?



Does Paco have any close friends?



Present Continuous (interrogative)

Short questions:

VERB TO BE + SUBJECT + VERB -ING + OBJECT?

Is Paco studying English with his sister?

With WH- questions

What are Paco and Sonia doing now?

**QUESTION WORD + VERB TO BE + SUBJECT + ANY VERB -ING +
OBJECT?**

Why is Alex going to play football now?

Does Paco have any close friends?



Present Simple vs. Present Continuous

- **SIMPLE PRESENT**

Actions in general (regularly, often, never):

Colin plays football every Tuesday.

Present actions happening one after another:

First Colin plays football, then he watches TV.

- **PRESENT CONTINUOUS**

Right now:

Look! Colin is playing football now.

Also for several actions happening at the same time:

Colin is playing football and Anne is watching.



Does Paco have any close friends?



Intonation in English: Interrogative

Rising intonation:

Yes / No questions: *Is Paco coming today?*

Falling intonation:

Wh- questions: When is Paco coming?



Does Paco have any close friends?



Leisure time vocabulary

Likes and dislikes:

I like playing tennis at weekends.

Paco likes going to the cinema.

I dislike playing computer games.

Paco doesn't like playing golf.
