**SUBJECT + TO BE + P. PARTICIPLE + OBJECTS AND
COMPLEMENTS + AGENT***

***The agent is not mentioned if it is not important or unknown**

Passive voice with modal verbs

THE SAME STRUCTURE

- *The 'Big Five' can be found here.*
- *A great variety of animals can be contemplated here.*
- *Some hippos might be found too.*
- *Animals can't be fed.*
- *Packed means would be prepared.*



Some sentences can't be made passive

- **Intransitive verbs:** *He stayed in the hotel.*
- **Verb 'have':** *Paco has a new camera.*
- **Verb 'resemble':** *Paco resembles his father.*
- **Verbs with a reflexive pronoun as object:** *The little boy dressed himself.*
